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

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THE University of the Philippines Visayas held the Investiture Ceremony of its 10th Chancellor, Dr. Ricardo P. Babaran, on August 29, 2018, at the University's Little Theater, Iloilo City campus.

CHED Chairman Prospero De Vera and UP President Danilo Concepcion led the investiture rites, together with the members of the UP Board of Regents that include Alumni Regent Ramon Moronilla, Faculty Regent Patricia Arinto, Staff Regent Liza Fulvadora, Student Regent Ivy Joy P. Taroma, Regents Hon. Francis C. Laurel, Hon. Angelo A. Jimenez, Hon. Frederick Mikhail I. Farolan and Hon. Roberto Mj Lara Secretary of the University and of the Board of Regents.

Executive Vice President Teodoro Herbosa, UP Vice Presidents Nestor Yunque, Jose Dalisay, Jr, Elvira Zamora, and Hector Danny Uy were also present. Babaran is the 10th Chancellor of UPV who was appointed by the UP Board of Regents on October 18, 2017, after a Search Process.

He is a faculty member of the College of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences where he also earned his BS Fisheries degree. He graduated with the MS Engineering degree from the University of Washington and earned his Ph.D. in Fisheries Science at Kagoshima University in Japan.

Legarda, Cimatu lead book launch on **Panay-Guimaras traditional knowledge**



SEN. Loren B. Legarda and Sec. Roy Cimatu were the guests of honor and the keynote speakers during the launching of the book, "From Seas to the Mountains (Kadagatan tubtob Kabukidan); Panay-Guimaras Traditional Knowledge System" held at the UP Visayas Auditorium, Iloilo City on August 9, 2018, Thursday.

The coffee table book is the product and final output of a project entitled, "Book on Panay-Guimaras Traditional Knowledge Systems for Cultural Resiliency and Sustainable Development" (TKS-CRSD)." It was conceptualized to revitalize the core of Panay-Guimaras culture through a book documenting and featuring traditional knowledge systems (TKS) that impact cultural resiliency and sustainable development.

Divided into five themes, book features articles and photographs on the following: 1.) Forest and Biodiversity (Forestry); 2.) Water Bodies and the Coastal Environment (Fisheries); 3.) Arable and Habitable Terrains (Agriculture); 4.) Sustainable Arts and Crafts (Arts and Crafts); and 5.) Environmental Rituals and Traditions (Literature and Rituals).

Department Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) tapped the University of the Philippines Visayas to spearhead the publication of this book. Collaborations were done with other universities namely, University of Antique, Aklan State University, West Visayas State University, Capiz State University, and Guimaras State College for its completion.

As we launch this book today coinciding with the celebration of Indigenous Peoples Day, it is my hope that we could encourage Filipinos to learn more about our indigenous roots through publications such as this Panay-Guimaras book on traditional knowledge systems," said Legarda, who has been supportive of efforts to document indigenous knowledge systems in all regions in the country.

Cimatu described the book as a "book for prosperity."

"We wanted to preserve in written, as well as visual record, of how traditional knowledge systems and practices promoted cultural resiliency and sustainable development in the islands of Panay and Guimaras," he said.

Anna Razel Ramirez is the Coordinator for the project. The book writers are the following: Dr. John Barrios, (Literature and Rituals), Joyce Christine Colon (Farming Practices and Traditions), Sashah Dioso (Ocean/Marine and Coastal Environment), Martin Genodepa (Arts and Crafts), and Dr. Randy Madrid, (Forest and Biodiversity).

The Editor of the book is Prof. Martin G. Genodepa while the principal photography was provided by Ramon Ramirez. UP Professor Émeritus and anthropologist, Dr. Magos, served as Chief Editor and Consultant. (Ms. Lyncen M. Fernandez)

UP Visayas hosts system-wide administrative management and staff conference



"YOU are a pillar in the growth and development of the University of the Philippines," said UP Visayas Chancellor Ricardo Babaran to the administrative personnel as he welcomed them to the UPV Miagao campus along with UP System and CU officials and delegates to the 1st UP System-wide Administrative Management and Staff Conference held in its scenic, sprawling campus in Miagao, Iloilo on July 12-14, 2018.

The Conference was held in response to evolving scenarios in the workplace, public demands, and the development of new technologies which affect the administrative

personnel. It has served as a venue for the UP management and workers in discussing how to improve University management by empowering the employees' role in enhancing productivity and public service delivery. At the same time, the Conference also discussed ways by which employees can be protected in the workplace and boost their morale and dignity. It went with the theme: "Serving with honor, dignity and compassion: Reaffirming the role of administrative personnel as partners in governance."

The administrative personnel of all of UP's Constituent Universities

with their respective Chancellor and some officials, participated in the Conference. It kicked off with a welcome dinner on July 11 at the UPV Auditorium of the City campus and ended with a coastal clean-up at the UPV Marine Biological Station in Taklong Island, Guimaras on July 14.

The Conference goals during the two-day lectures and discussions were the following: 1.) Achieving a more competent and productive administrative sector adequate protections and a proper perspective on public service; and 2.) Strengthening management and personnel partnership.

The topics for the Conference included the following: Empowering the Administrative Support to Operations Strengthening Employee Development Program; Facets of Public Service: Service with Compassion; Disaster Risk Reduction/Climate Change:

Employee Protection at Work and at Home; Enhancing Health and Wellness: "Life Coaching" - Taking Care of Self and Family during Employment; and Legal Protection of Personnel in the Conduct of Service. The Resource Persons were Hon. Regent Angelo Jimenez; Hon. Regent Frederick Mikhail Farolan; Former VP for Administration Maragtas S.V. Amante; Current VP for Administration Nestor Yunque; Former Congressman Satur Ocampo; and Dr. Henrietta Española, MD.

UPV SEEDS-TBI start-up gets DOST financial grant to field test e-Procurement software

INFODYNAMICS Technologies, a start-up affiliated with the UP Visayas - Small Enterprise and Entrepreneurial Development Technology B (SEEDS-TBI), Services Business Incubator recently granted a financial grant to field test its software application by the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) effective March 2018.

InfoDynamics Technologies

was founded by Engr. Jose Rizaldy G. Harder. Ms. Frediezel G. de Leon, Project Leader of SEEDS-TBI, disclosed that one of its incubates has developed an e-Procurement Software (ePS) designed for the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) of all government agencies. The software complies with government standards and automates the procurement operations of any government institution. The proposed users

of the software are the Local Government Units (LGUs), State Universities and Colleges (SUCs), National Government Agencies (NGAs), Government-Owned and Controlled Corporation (GOCCs), Government Hospitals, Higher Education Institutions (HĔIs), and Barangays. Thus, it can be used nationwide in any area of procurement management.

The Small Enterprise and

Entrepreneurial Development Services Technology Business Incubator (SEEDS-TBI) is a multidisciplinary project organized by the University of the Philippines Visayas (UPV) – College of Management and the Department Science and Technology (DOST VI). 1,137 first year students enter L Visayas

BECAUSE of the K-12 program, UP Visayas, along with the tertiary institutions in the country, had no first year student admissions for the past two years. This year the first product of the K-12 program entered college. On August 6, 2018, UP Visayas held its first Opening Exercises after two years to welcome first year students into the folds of the university.

Like the rest of the country's higher education institutions, UPV's student population is composed of the first year, fourth year, and other returning students.

Held at the newly renovated and spacious covered court on the Miagao campus, the Ceremony was an occasion to introduce to the first-year students the officials, various degreegranting units, research and extension services offices and facilities of UPV,

as well as the various support offices and their officials and personnel.

This year's data enrolment reveals that the College of Arts and Sciences remains to have the highest enrolment among UPV's degreegranting units.

The Opening Exercises also included an inspirational message from an alumna in the person of Ma. Lucia G. Mondragon (BS Management 1992) and the President, LIBCAP Holdings Corporation.

Whelver N. Surnido, a 4th year BS Fisheries student, spoke for the upper class while RB Jann G. Jamindang, 1st year BS Applied

Mathematics responded on behalf of his batchmates.

Chancellor Ricardo Babaran welcomed the incoming first year and returning students, and the faculty, and formally declared the opening of Academic Year 2018-2019. (Ms. Lyncen M. Fernandez)

Mondragon challenges incoming first year to excel and give back

"ANG "Iskolar ng Bayan" ibig sabihin nyan ay pinag-aral ng bayan. I was recipient of this as well as you because you are now here in UP. As such, I strongly believe that it is our obligation to pay it forward in whatever form. This disposition of giving back is an act of self-offering. This is the very symbol of our Oblation."

These were the words of UP Visayas alumna, Ma. Lucia G. Mondragon (BS Management 1992) during her message at the University's Opening Exercises on August 6, 2018 at the Covered Court of the Miagao campus.

The President of LIBCAP Holdings Corporation shared lessons in life that her parents taught her such as the following: 1.) valuing of hard work; 2.) knowing how to manage time; 3.) handling money

wisely; and 4.) valuing one's family.

"I grew up in a very traditional, hardworking, and simple household with my parents and four siblings. Both my parents strived to provide financial stability for me and my siblings so that we would not experience all the hardships they went through," she recalled.

Forward-looking, Mondragon also reminded the incoming first

year as well as returning students that UP will prepare them for the real world. "We are trained to survive. UP exposes us to a very diverse social environment in terms of character, belief, stature in life, family backgrounds, and religious belief... it teaches us to be open-minded and to respect each other's individuality."

In addition, she said that UP takes its students through a journey of self-discovery and independence. She emphasized though that the sense of freedom to think and decide for oneself that UP encourages its students to exercise, should always be



paired with a sense of responsibility and accountability.

'So I am encouraging you to bloom where you are planted. "Kahit saan, kahit ano pa man, galingan mo, gandahan mo," she said at the end of her message. (Ms. Lyncen M. Fernandez)

100% passing rate for UPV's Guidance Licensure Examination takers

SINCE 2014, the University of the Philippines Visayas has maintained the 100% passing percentage for the

Guidance Counselor Licensure Examination (GCLE) for five straight years, with five new test-takers coming from the University this year.

conducts fish - farmer friendly sediment quality monitoring training

THE Institute of Marine Fisheries and Oceanology (IMFO), College of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences (CFOS), UP Visayas (UPV) conducted an information drive and training on sediment quality monitoring in fish farms in the provinces of Guimaras and Capiz.

The Project was implemented in fish farms in Brgy. Lawi, Guimaras on July 20, 2018 participated in by five (5) fish cage operators. The same activity was conducted in two barangays in Roxas City, Capiz on July 31 and August 1, 2018. Seventeen fish farm operators and tenants took

part in the training.
According to Prof. Sheila S. de Leon, faculty member of IMFO and one of the Project proponents, the conduct of the public service activity was very timely with the repeated massive fish kill events. Sediments, a sink of organic matter underneath fish farms, become toxic to benthic organisms such as worms, crabs, and shells when they receive too much uneaten feeds, feces, and other waste.

She and her team coordinated with the local government units and barangay captains of the subject barangays where the fish farms are situated. They went to individual fish farm operators and tenants to conduct lectures on sediment quality and to train them on the actual use of fabricated samplers to check the sediment quality of their respective fish farms. They conducted a demo and hands-on training on how to do the sampling using the fabricated samplers and

showed how to check the quality of the sediments using the indicators like color, odor, and presence of animals. This then enabled farmers to identify whether their farm has good or poor quality sediments.

A survey was also conducted before and after the training to assess the respondents' knowledge on sediment quality. De Leon said that they plan to conduct similar activity to other fish farm sites (Ms. L'enilyn B. Gallos)

OCEP, DILG holds another series of Training-Workshops on SUC-Assisted Approach in CDP Formulation



THE University of the Philippines Visayas, through the Office of Continuing Education and Pahinungod (OCEP), and in partnership with the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) Region 6, conducted a twoday training-workshop on June 18-19, 2018 at Smallville21 Hotel, Iloilo City. The activity aimed to review the Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP) Formulation process and the municipalities' vision using DILG's Rationalized Planning Indicators and Data System (RaPIDS).

The activity was participated in by the core planning team members of President Roxas, Capiz and six (6) municipalities from the Province of Antique namely, Bugasong, Barbaza, Culasi, Hamtic, Pandan, and Tibiao. The Municipal Mayors of the municipalities mentioned were also in attendance.

The two-day trainingworkshop sought to provide the local government officials with an allinclusive guide on the formulation of the CDP, its processes, and the concepts and plans related to it. The activities started with a message from Atty. Anthony C. Nuyda, DILG 6 Regional Director, who emphasized that the compliance of deliverables of the LGUs, specifically the CDP, must be taken seriously.

A series of lecturettes was conducted on the first day of training. Prof. Nicanor Babiera of the UPV College of Management, discussed the Concepts of Development, Cascading Global to Local Development Goals, Development Planning, CDP Planning Process, and the 33 LGU-mandated plans.
Ms. Jerilee Camena, UPV-CDP
Consultant, extensively explained the CDP, its planning cycle, and how it is distinct from the Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP). Ms. Giselle Grace Gerial, DILG 6 DRRM Regional Focal Person, wrapped up



the afternoon with a discussion on the importance of the Rationalized Planning Indicators and Data Sets (RaPIDŠ) in drafting a municipality's Ecological Profile and CDP.

Prof. Babiera also tackled the process of crafting a Vision Statement and its elements. Each municipality revisited its Vision Statement and deliberated if there is a need to revise it. "Vision Statements must be dynamic and vivid and should represent the whole community," Prof. Babiera said.

On the second day of training-workshop, municipality's core planning team was able to present the status of their LGU-mandated plans and showed how they were able to use the RaPIDS tool in revisiting their Vision Statements.

Also present in the said training were officials of DILG Region 6 that include Mr. Christian Nagaynay (DILG6 Planning Officer), Ms. Hershe Pausa (LGOO II, Negros Island Region), Ms. Grace Natalie Azarraga (Antique Cluster Leader), and Mr. Alan Aldivera (Capiz Cluster Leader). The Municipal Local Government Operations Officers (MLGOOs) of each town was also present during the activity.

This training was part of a series of activities that will be conducted by OCEP and the DILG until the partner municipalities have formulated their CDPs as well as their Ecological Profile and their Local Development Investment Program (LDIP). The OCEP is the extension arm of UPV that implements the "SUC-Assisted Approach in the Formulation of the Comprehensive Development Plan Project" led by Dr. Rhodella A. Ibabao (Director, OCEP and Project Manager) with team members from the College of Management and the College of Arts and Sciences and a representative from the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research and Extension (OVCRE). It was held on September 11-14, 2018 at the Carl von Ossietzky University of Oldenburg, Germany.

The study discussed the

population aspects of the structure of the gonadal maturation stages of E. mederi in Capiz, Philippines to establish information on the reproductive biology aspects of the species. A chancellor with a heart for serving the fisheries sector

"WE know that we are giving true service when we give a part of ourselves and it hurts in the process. I, therefore, encourage everyone who is interested in fish, fisheries, and fishers; we know we are doing something good for this sector when we give a positive image of the University whenever we engage them."

Babaran, full professor and UP Scientist, has always been an ardent and dedicated researcher in marine fisheries, particularly capture fisheries. He said that he decided to go ahead and have the Investiture held despite it being late (almost 10 months after he was appointed) because he wanted to give due recognition to all who have contributed immensely into helping him become what he is today. He also wanted to give honor to the College of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences (CFOS), pointing out that it is "the institution that gave me the institutional platform to engage with the country's poorest sector." He wanted to focus on

the sector that UPV is mandated to serve – the fishers, specifically, but more broadly, residents of coastal communities.

The Making of a Chancellor

The Chancellor paid homage to his parents, particularly his mother, who he said was responsible for building his character and that of his seven siblings.

"My parents taught me and my brothers about the value of honesty, industry, and love for work; they also demonstrated to us how to serve with dedication - all character-building values, which I believe are necessary for the job of a UPV Chancellor," he pointed out.

He recounted that his love for fisheries started in his childhood wherein fishing was part of his life.

"... even at an early age, I did different things that, I think, eventually mattered in my current career. I would wake up sometimes early in the morning to go out fishing. Fishing was something I enjoyed doing, whenever there were opportunities to do so. I did not pay much attention to insect bites; occasional leech bites did not even bother or deter me. During those mornings, I kept

wondering to myself as to why very few of my playmates were not into fishing when it is so much fun," he recalled.

Babaran revealed that he also wanted to be an engineer like his father but financial constraints led him to instead avail of the FEM scholarship program for fisheries that brought him to UP Diliman.

He recalled that it was his mother's determination that made it possible for him to continue with his studies. She put together and collated the necessary papers for him to take the examinations for the fisheries scholarship program.

From UP Diliman to UPV

Miagao "In Diliman, fisheries students were discriminated against by non-fisheries students. have met non-fisheries classmates who openly wondered what there was to learn about fisheries and wondered even more whether fisheries students need four years just to learn how to capture fish with a hook and line. Of course, we now know how ignorant questions like these are, long harbored by students during our time, and perhaps even now, are among the reasons why there is less appreciation for

the fisheries discipline and why, as a result, fish-based industries in the country are now faring poorly," he lamented.

The FEM scholarship program, according to him, was part of a much bigger national agenda for the fisheries sector. It was decided that the College of Fisheries, then based in Diliman, was to be transferred in Iloilo and merged with the UP College Iloilo, UP Tacloban College, and UP Cebu College. The merging formed into another Constituent University now called UP Visayas with broad mandates in fisheries and marine sciences.

"Many of the Fisheries Batch 1980 must have performed well in the eyes of the College of Fisheries administrators at that time because five of us got invited to join the College. In my case, I was offered to proceed to graduate school along disciplines that were completely different from fisheries - naval architecture and ocean engineering" he recalled.

ocean engineering," he recalled.

He studied at the University of Washington with a study plan that included a lot of required mathematics and engineering courses at the undergraduate level. He said these should have been taken before he did graduate school but managed to handle the

difficulties. He had to request for an extended stay, however.

"Because of the turbulent political conditions here in the Philippines in the mid-1980s, UPV fellows and other Filipinos I met in the US asked me why I should still go back when so many others back home were trying so hard to get out of the country. Of course, I was always conscious that my study abroad was funded through a World Bank loan. Despite the troubled times, it never occurred to me to renege on my obligation. There was also an overpowering feeling to contribute something, to make a difference at home," he emphasized.

Casualties in the Miagao Transfer

Babaran said he returned from his studies in 1990 "only to witness a general discontent brewing among the so-called Miagao pioneers, my fisheries peers."

"The rather confused state of UPV's affairs in Miagao and all sorts of dire stories were disconcerting. He said these included disrupted lives such as broken families, broken marriages, loneliness, a sense of isolation, alcoholism, and families who were dislocated after the death of a family member who was the UP employee."

"It was difficult to work with the right state of mind when faced with a condition like that. I think only those with a firm resolve to embrace what Miagao is all about, in relation to what UP did to get us there, stayed on. I also believed even then that those who fully understood how much the people of Miagao sacrificed to host us there, will continue to see the relevance of UPV's main campus in our lives here in UP."

The Making of an Administrator

When Babaran became Director of the CFOS Institute of Marine Fisheries and Oceanology, he was already doing initiatives on research linkage collaborations. The 10-Year Japan Society for the Promotion of Science – Department of Science and Technology between UPV and Kagoshima University, along with other SUCs in the Philippines

and other universities in Japan, according to him, brought UPV back from near stagnation towards a more mainstreamed role as a Constituent University. The program allowed many UPV faculty members across colleges and 10 other universities in the Philippines to find partner scientists from various Japanese universities.

The Chancellor credited the Core University Program for paving the way for him to meet Prof. Tatsuro Matsuoka of Kagoshima University Faculty of Fisheries. He said Matsuoka led the team that was responsible for mentoring him and allowed him to get his Ph.D. degree.

"I learned that the Japanese are generally very formal, but when a certain degree of trust or mutual respect between partners is attained, they consider you as your friend, and the word of a friend usually carries a bigger weight than a signed contract," he observed of the Japanese culture.

He also noted that the Core University Program taught him how to deal with international partners more effectively and he was introduced to new processes that were helpful to him when he became Vice Chancellor for Research and Extension.

"I learned that careful planning was the key to successful outcomes. This is an important point to stress at this juncture as we are all talking about zero-based budgeting. I also realized that it was all right to commit mistakes provided the act of committing mistakes is part of the learning process," he explained.

"After my exposure to the Japanese way of doing research, I realized that the things I can now do are limited only by my capacity to imagine. This, I think, was quite powerful in guiding my subsequent activities," he noted.

Search for Greater Relevance for UPV

"UPV contributes a paltry number to the manpower needs of the country at the Ph.D. level. As an administrator for a Constituent University that is primarily mandated to address the concerns of fishers, it is incumbent upon us as constituents of the National University to realize that this mandate was not given to a single college of UPV," he pointed out. He said the burden of bearing the load to help the entire fisheries sector has to be shared by every academic unit of UPV.

Babaran also said that UPV should assist SUCs throughout the country in generating collective knowledge related to fisheries and "all collateral disciplines, especially in an environment that is made more challenging by the archipelagic nature of the country."

He said this was the reason why UPV went out of its way to invite presidents and representatives of SUCs to grace the Investiture Ceremony.

"Their presence here symbolizes a joint declaration of our institutions to work together for a common cause. We need to truly anchor our activities in addressing the problems that hobble society and learn how to mobilize our partners," he elaborated.

The Chancellor also said that there is a need to change the way research is being done. "We do research actively asking for issues that beset our people and designing solutions for them," he pointed out.

"It is important to realize that we all need to work together as partners by focusing on the needs of all stakeholders, not just the big and well-endowed corporations. Our outputs are just as important if we solve pressing issues that afflict the small and underprivileged sectors of our society. All of them have problems that open opportunities for us to render service. But such service must always be done with honor and excellence," he also added.

The Chancellor invited Dr. Loel Losanes, CFOS alumnus and Filipino head of Japan's Hikari Corporation, probably the largest producer of golden south sea pearls throughout the world.

He said discussions have been initiated to address pressing issues that beset their operations, not just about the organism that they are culturing but about a wide range of issues that will surely benefit them but would also give positive results to their host communities.

Also invited were the members of the Kamamado fishers from Guimaras, many of whom are elderly women who supplement their daily income with P40 they get from selling the equivalent of 2 litersized containers of captured cardinal fish.

"Through this group, we will mobilize a major program that will promote responsible fisheries, which I believe will position the Philippines more strategically in relation to the ornamental fish industry that generates \$7-8B annually. I honestly believe that we can innovate solutions that will lighten their daily struggles."

Emerging Plans

Also in his speech, the Chancellor identified three major aspects of UPV's operations that will be restructured to have better outcomes for the entire country in relation to its mandate in the fisheries and aquatic sciences. These are the reintroduction of the Graduate School, the implementation of a comprehensive quality assurance system that extends beyond academics, and the deepening of UPV community engagements.

Babaran also reiterated his support for the bid of the UPV Tacloban College to eventually become the next Constituent Unit of UP. "I am glad to be making this declaration before nine of the 11 sitting members of UP's Board of Regents because UPV will need your support," he said to them who were present during the ceremony.

during the ceremony.

At the end of his speech,
Babaran honored his mother
once more "for sacrificing her
UP education to be a mother to
her eight naturally born children"
who are now professionals in
their respective sectors field.

He also acknowledged his wife Riza who, he says, has qualities like her mother and his daughter Hannah for understanding his commitment and dedication to serving the University. He likewise thanked the UPV community for its support. (Ms. Lyncen M. Fernandez)

At the end of the boot camp, the participants packaged and submitted ten research proposals. The proposals did not just focus on the biophysical aspect associated with HABs but also touched other areas such as social sciences, information technology, and engineering. (Mr. John O. de la Cruz)

UPV conducts orientation on **Data Privacy Act (RA 10173)**

UP Visayas conducted an orientation for its employees on the Data Privacy Act of 2012 (RA 10173) through its designated Data Protection Officer, Mr. Wilfredo Palete, Jr., on July 10, 2018, at the Miagao, Iloilo campus.

The Data Privacy Act (DPA) was created in response to the evergrowing use of the Internet in the Philippines for business particularly through digital economy and international trade relations and for personal use with the Filipinos' heavy penchant for social media, thus the need to strengthen privacy and security protections.

and security protections.
The DPA's purpose is "to protect

the fundamental human right of privacy, of communication while ensuring free flow of information to promote innovation and growth." (Republic Act. No. 10173, Ch. 1, Sec. 2). The National Privacy Commission was established to

enforce and oversee the DPA.

In a nutshell, this means that personal information should be safeguarded not only by the person concerned but by the company or institution to which he is connected. Personal information refers to "any information, whether recorded in a material form or not, from which the identity of an individual is apparent or can be reasonably and

directly ascertained by the entity holding the information, or, when put together with other information, would directly and certainly identify an individual." (National Privacy Commission Tool Kit)

Personal information includes sensitive personal information that covers an individual's race, ethnic origin, marital status, age, color,

and religious, philosophical, or political affiliations. This also includes an individual's health, education, genetic or sexual life, and any proceeding for any offense committed or alleged to have been committed by such person, the disposal of such proceedings, or the sentence of any court in such

the sentence of any court in such proceedings.

The disclosure of personal information when needed for a legitimate purpose should have the consent of the person concerned and should only be used for the purpose intended. (Ms. Lyncen M. Fernandez)

Laureta, Jr., retired faculty member of the Institute of Aquaculture, College of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences, received his appointment as Professor Emeritus conferred by the Board of Regents during its 1334th Board of Regents Meeting on April 06, 2018, upon the recommendation of the President of the University, University of the Philippines System, effective upon his retirement on May 23, 2017. Laureta is the author of book titled "Compendium of the Economically Important Seashells in Panay, Philippines." The compendium is an important contribution to the knowledge on seashells of Panay Island. Other than that, the book is a valuable material for the study of Philippine marine fauna. For over twenty years, Dr. Laureta taught fisheries subjects on Invertebrates and Aquatic Ecology to the undergraduate students of



the University. His research for the past decade centered on the biology and hatchery of some commercially important mollusks in the Region and on the development of a strategy for the sustainable production of the oriental angelwing, Pholas orientalis, one of the most sought bivalves in the country. Before his retirement, he has also served as the Program Leader for the DOST funded program on mussel titled: "Enhancement of Hatchery and Nursery Practices for a Reliable Supply of Quality Seeds for the Green Mussel (Perna viridis) Farming.
