



Tiu to deliver valedictory address in UPV's 37th Commencement Exercises

ON the 37th Commencement Exercises of UP Visayas on June 24, 2016, Juliene Lindy C. Tiu will have the distinction of delivering the valedictory address to the graduating Class of 2016. This because Tiu, a BS Accountancy major from the College of Management, has earned the highest GWA of 1.282 among her peers.

Tiu graduated class valedictorian in elementary and in high school at the Iloilo Central Commercial High School, now Huasiong College of Iloilo. Her being a consistent university scholar brought her to graduate as magna cum laude at the end of the five-year accountancy program that she enrolled in.

The consistent university scholar found time to join and win in competitions that were particularly related to her field.

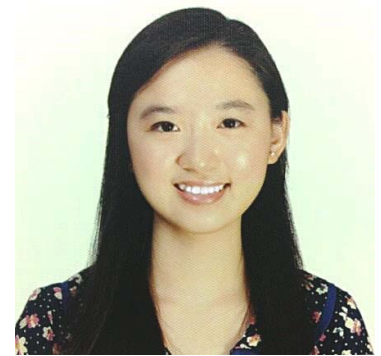
These included: 1st place in the 2014 IFJPIA Practical Accounting 1 and 2 Quiz Bee (Team Competition), 1st place in the 2015 PICPA Iloilo Chapter Practical Accounting 1 and 2 Quiz Bowl (Team Competition), 1st place in the 2016 17th InterCollegiate Finance Competition (ICFC)-Western Visayas Regional Level, and 2nd place in the 2015 CIMA Global Business Challenge (GBC)- National Level. She also won Best Speaker/Best Future Business Leader in the CIMA Global Business Challenge (GBC)- National Level and 3rd place in 2015 NFJPIA- Region 6 11th Midyear Convention (MYC) Practical Accounting 2 Quiz Bee.

Of her life as a valedictorian among valedictorians and honor students in UP, she said that

it is very well known fact that UP's high academic standard can easily "dissipate a freshman student's illusions of superiority cultivated by his or her multiple achievements during high school."

"After all, high school valedictorians enter UP in thrones, and what was once a distinct medal of honor speedily becomes a common piece of metal. Coupled with this is the realization that other students, whether part of their high school honor roll or not, were just as brilliant as the ones who posed with awards on their graduation day. In short, I learned that finding a place in the den of great minds that is UP was a daunting challenge, indeed," she noted.

She recalled that failing to score the highest grade in Math 11, her favorite subject, was the

moment that she realized that she would not always be standing at the top. From then on she adopted a philosophy that she said carried her throughout her stay in UP and beyond.

"Don't compare yourself with others." It may be straightforward, but it's easier said than done, especially in a degree program like Accountancy where the retention system forces us to be perpetually grade-conscious. So, in order to spare myself the unnecessary grief, I stopped measuring myself against others and instead focused inward to simply be the best version of myself that I could be. This perspective allowed me to practice humility in the face of my achievements and to sincerely applaud the triumphs of others," she said of this self-realization.

She said that she was grateful for the guidance of her supportive family, nurturing mentors, and peers because she was truly able to enjoy her UP life despite the initial culture shock.

"From entering UP until now, I honestly did not expect to obtain the honor of becoming the class valedictorian, simply because I was aware of the sheer number of achievers among us. But somehow, God's grace granted me this achievement, and with the knowledge and opportunities the university has given me, I hope to contribute to society as someone who above all, uses education not as a pedestal to look down upon others, but as the catalyst for positive change," she said. "BESIDES honing my analytical skills, UP has taught me to be flexible, personality-wise. It has prepared me for life by keeping me grounded. In the four years that I have been a student, I realized that you cannot know everything and that's okay. One must learn to deal with one's limitation. What's important is the realization that since there is so much to learn out there, you just have to be always open to new ideas; and to never confine yourself to just one type of learning."

So says Reil Gallenero Abucay, BS in Applied Mathematics major from the College of Arts of Sciences who earned the distinction of having the highest GWA of 1.286 among the 2016 graduates of the College, magna cum laude.

The native of Tagbilaran City, Bohol, was already an academic achiever during his elementary years wherein he graduated as valedictorian and with high honors in high school.

In the 2012 UP College Admission Test, Abucay was ranked among the top 10% of all UPCAT qualifiers. Because of this, he was a recipient of a UP Government Scholarship and also qualified for a DOST- RA Scholarship based on competitive examination.

The road to becoming a magna cum laude was achieved by being a consistent college and university scholar. Although he thinks that he did not have a lot of extra-curricular activities, he was actively involved with the

UPV Mathematics Circle, the UP Kadugong Bol-anon Iloilo Chapter, and supported the various activities of the Elektrons, the academic organization where he belongs. He also served as a peer tutor at the UPV Teaching and Learning Center and worked as a Student Assistant at the CAS Office of the College Secretary.

"In UP, we are taught to be critical thinkers. While it is good to be one, my years in college has also made me realize that life is still better when things are kept simple. Sometimes a blue house is just painted blue and that does not necessarily mean gloom. Sometimes the two-liner math solutions get higher merit than the two-page ones. It always pays to know when to think critically and when to see things as they are. Always strive to strike the balance," he observed.

THE story of UP students coming from a life of poverty and making something of themselves is a narrative that continues to inspire and awe. One never gets tired of being told about it.

Such is the story of Jia P. Marcellano, a BS Biology graduate who is graduating at the top of Class 2016 of the UPV Tacloban College, *magna cum laude* with a GWA of 1.392.

Marcellano was born to a humble family whose father is a tricycle driver and a housewife for a mother. She said that they live in a house built on a land

that is not theirs.

“My father, Cornelio Marcellano, works hard to provide for us while my mother, Violeta Marcellano, plays the invaluable role of being a housekeeper. My sister Ethel and I grew up in a place where sung lullabies lured us to sleep instead of television,” she recalled.

Marcellano finished her elementary education at Sta. Ana Elementary School, La Paz, Leyte as class valedictorian. She earned her secondary education at Burauen Comprehensive National High school, Burauen, Leyte and achieved the highest honors.

“I entered UP Tacloban full of hope and determination, but not full of money. I enrolled in BS Biology, armed not with the dream of becoming a doctor but with a scholarship from DOST and the desire to learn about natural sciences. I faced the challenges of college life armed with the knowledge that in order to maintain my scholarship, I have to weather some storms

and burnhundreds of midnight candles. That I had to weather a literalstorm named Yolanda was something that I was never prepared for but survived,” she narrated.

“Factionless” was how Marcellano is viewed herself, a term used to describe students who are not active in any student organizations aside from academic and scholarship based groups.

“I was a scholar, in the truest sense of the word. I enjoy doing research and presenting them to various audiences because there is nothing more fulfilling than sharing ideas and innovations,” she pointed out.

Although she has witnessed the fight for freedom and rights in the university requiring some students to be politically engaged, she said that for people such as herself, “the willingness to question conventional opinions and to pursue academic

excellence in order to help other people also define a fight for the same cause.”

“They say that good things happen to those who dream and to those who work for their dreams. However, I was not born a dreamer. I could not afford the luxury of dreaming, I only seized moments and conquered them,” she said of herself.

Lastly, Marcellano said that she is leaving the university with plans of pursuing higher education and research in microbiology.

“I would like to create a trail and be a torchlight for those students who are still looking for their way for I too was once lost as well. We should continuously seek freedom through our actions, through our academic endeavors and through the various questions we ask because knowledge is power.” (*Lyncen M. Fuertes leads CFOS graduates

HUMBLE beginnings did not deter Vince Neil B. Fuertes, the younger of the two children of Herculino M. Fuertes and Aileen Hazel B. Fuertes, to achieve academic excellence. The native of Dipatlong, Maribojoc, Bohol said he and an older sister were raised by their parents accustomed to simple living.

As a Bachelor of Science in Fisheries graduate, with a GWA of 1.447, Fuertes ends his undergraduate life in UP as *magna cum laude* and leads the College of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences 2016 graduates.

“Back then and until now, we never had much. My mother is a public school teacher while my father is the assistant head of the

DRRM of the Maribojoc LGU,” he said. He credits his mother as the one who made sure that they would value education. It was no surprise then that he and her older sister were consistently at the top of their class during their elementary years and both graduated as valedictorians in Santa Cruz Elementary School. He also graduated with honors (1st) in Tagbilaran City Science High School.

Fuertes added that at a young age, he already had an inclination towards the sciences, spending hours reading science books, watching science shows and enjoying science subjects. He competed and won in science competitions in elementary and high school.

“I had high hopes upon entering UP because it is not just a university but a learning institution where the best of the best are found. Fisheries was not my first choice as degree program because I really wanted to be a Chemical Engineer like my sister. But my father suggested that I take fisheries because UPV is known to be the Center of Excellence in fisheries education,” he pointed out.

He said that despite having a hard time adjusting to the “UP way of life” and even attempted to shift, he now thinks that majoring in fisheries was really his destiny after qualifying for the Fisheries Scholarship Program (FSP) for Industry Leaders under the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources.

He learned to love the program, adjust to the “UP way of life,” and become a consistent university and college scholar with the support of his family, teachers and friends in the student organizations where he joined such as the UP Kadugong Bol-anon (organization of Boholanos in UP), UP Sonata (organization of music lovers and players in the university), and the Pufferfish Project Band.

“Fisheries is not just about catching fish, like what most people assume, rather, it is about food security, sustainability and technology. It was a privilege to be trained by brilliant professors. It is through them that I was able to further enhance my knowledge and skills in the field,” he emphasized.

He said that one of the best advices that he received as a student was from his thesis adviser, Dr. Fiona L. Pedroso, who said “Science does not stop because of hindrances, it progresses.”

observed.
