Ma. Sheena M. Escordial, UP Visayas Valedictorian of Class 2018 has this to say to her fellow graduates.

The BS in Applied Mathematics major, from the College of Arts and Sciences, earned the distinction of graduating summa cum laude, from among her 900 plus peers.

"Quiet, unassuming, maybe even be described as the shy type. But once she opens her mouth in class discussions or make presentations for her various subjects, she surprises you with the depth and substance of her ideas."

This is how Prof. Arnel Tampo, faculty member of the Division of Physical Sciences and Mathematics, describes Escordial.

For those who know her, they do not find it surprising for Escordial to have achieved this acclaim for she has always been a consistent honor student during her elementary and high school years, graduating as valedictorian in both levels in Bacolod City schools where she also was born. In UP Visayas, she was a DOST Scholar and a UP Presidential Scholar.

She credits the love for learning and being persistent as two reasons behind her academic achievements.

"Mathematics is my first love ever since my elementary days. At the end

of high school, I really wanted to take up a degree which is entirely on math so I took up B.S. in Applied Math." She added that her love for learning is not just in math, but also in all other things.

"It's doing the best in whatever I do and always aiming for improvement. Whenever I lose my motivation to study, I just think of why I fell in love with math in the first place. The support and sacrifices of my family also help me to get back on track."

When it comes to being persistent she said that the important thing is to never give up. "There are times when things are difficult, but don't quit. Rest for a while, and try again later. It always pays off to be hardworking."

To incoming first-year students, the first product of the K-12 program who are entering college this year, she has this to say:

"Always be eager to learn. Develop good study habits. Try to find ways on how you can apply what you are learning inside the classroom in real life. Before you know it, you'll see that studying and learning something new is quite fun. Explore the libraries, study areas, student lounges, etc. Find your motivation as to why you wake up each day and don't lose it. It is also important to take a break and have recreations. Take care of yourself."

In addition, she said that students should not pressure themselves to be the best among others, but be the best version of themselves.

"Be gentle and be kind. Have a genuine connection with others. Understand that the people you meet come from different walks of life. Be with people who brings out the best in you. Don't give up, life is a battle for everyone. Keep trying. Join activities and organizations which will help you maximize your potential. If you have any problems, reach out to your peer facilitators; they are very willing to help you. Appreciate the moral support your family and friends give you. Most importantly, just enjoy and have fun with your peers."

Limosnero has a very active student life, participating and winning in various regional and national competitions such as search for outstanding accounting student, accounting quiz, accounting tournaments, and the likes.

"The most important life lesson that my UP education and experience have taught me is the virtue of humility. I have accepted that there are certain things I cannot do, and that there will always be someone who is

much better than I am. I ask for questions when I do not know, and seek help from others whenever I feel that I cannot do something on my own. This commitment to seek answers as well as the willingness to accept new ideas – even if they contradict my own personal views – allowed me to acquire more knowledge and insights and look at multiple perspectives, which I could not otherwise learn or obtain by myself," he said when asked what his UP education has taught him.

He credits his academic achievements on self-motivation and self-discipline.

"Self-motivation has been one of the reasons for my academic achievements. My primary sources of motivation are the short, intermediate and long-term goals and vision that I have for myself. By envisioning my future, I create a unique version of "myself." I constantly push myself harder every time, and create accountability checks that help me evaluate both my progress and performance.

"I am also motivated by the idea of personal growth and development. I feel a great passion in learning. As Mortimer Adler said, "The purpose of learning is growth, and our minds, unlike our bodies,

can continue growing for as long as we live."

When it comes to self-discipline he believes that excellence is an attitude, rather than an end in itself. "The short term goals as well as the long-term vision that I have set for myself would be futile if I do not commit myself towards their achievement. It is good to be motivated, but discipline, unlike motivation, requires mental toughness and, as such, persists in the long term."

He said he was willing to endure and overcome challenges that he encountered during his stay in UP.

To the incoming first year students of UP, he has this to say:

"Explore the limitless potential in you. Be curious. Have debates with yourself and challenge other's point of view. Go beyond traditional ways of thinking by exploring non-conventional platforms. Get comfortable with challenges and with failure, acknowledging that growth and self-improvement can only happen outside your comfort zone."

As his own life as a college student in UP draws to a close, Lima remembers the incoming first year students and shared some words of wisdom in as far as making the most out of their UP education and experiences.

Touzo earns highest honor among CFOS graduates

FOR having earned the highest GWA among her peers in the College of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences, Kyle Iris C. Touzo, BS Fisheries, received the highest honor, graduating as *magna cum laude*.

The native of Surigao City said that she is very interested to further study the different ways biotechnology can be applied to aquaculture. She said her stay in UP has given her experience in planning and organizing lecture-fora and outreach programs.

When asked what life lesson has UP taught her that will serve her well in her chosen field, she said:

“UP taught me that it is important to be patient while working hard in your chosen field. As a student of science, there are times when we are made to wait. Results do not magically appear after following a few steps, and these are not always the results we hoped for. Sometimes

we have to postpone the rejoicing because we have to do everything again from the beginning. During these moments, patience for the current situation can save us from being stuck at a roadblock. This attitude helps us reframe our minds, and pushes us to continue our work. Success does not come easy. We have to be patient, and we need to trust the process.”

As for teachers that inspired her to have a thirst for learning, she said that those teachers are the ones who engage their students in class discussions but are respectful in critiquing and evaluating their answers and insights.

“I believe that the minds of the students are more active when they are truly involved in class activities, and they tend to remember the lessons better when they have a direct experience with it. One problem that students encounter is that they are detached with the lesson most of the time, especially when the exchange of knowledge

is one-sided. Thus, I am inspired to learn when teachers are giving their best to interact with their students during class.”

Touzo also pointed out that UP students are very much aware that learning goes beyond the four corners of the classroom.

“My thirst for learning is fueled every time teachers send us out for community immersions. These activities remind me that the problems discussed inside the classroom are actually experienced by the people, and the purpose of studying fisheries is to sufficiently equip ourselves with knowledge so that we can eventually help uplift the marginalized sector. These are the teachers who pushed us to contribute to the society and made us realize that we gained a lot of learnings after we finish the course.”

Touzo shared her worst and best memories of UP.

“The worst was being away from home and from the life I was used to, especially when I heavily depended

on my family. I also learned that I am my worst enemy. The times when I lost all motivation were the hardest, waking up every morning without a sense of purpose was the fight I dreaded because, to begin with, I never wished to wake up in the morning stripped off my self-worth.”

She said that she dealt with it despite of the fact the situation was extremely hard.

“Looking back, I realized that the calm after the worst moments is akin to the calm after the storm. When you make it through the tempest, you learn that recovery is possible. You come to terms with your bad moments, and transform them into learning experiences.”

Lastly, she said her best memories were the people who stuck with her during the worst of times, and celebrated with her on her good days. In the end, I think the UP experience is remembering both the best and the worst memories, and embracing them as part of ourselves. (**Lyncen M. Fernandez**)
